<p><b>Apply in person for a U.S. Passport at the Post Office or another location that will accept passport applications as soon as possible.</b></p> <p>Bring Certified U.S. Birth Certificate, completed forms, parent(s) and passport photos. Do not sign forms until asked to do so.</p> <p>One parent must attend for youth age 16 &amp; 17. Both parents must attend for youth younger than 16, or provide notarized consent form from the non-attending parent.</p> <p><i>** Youth who are not citizens of the United States should contact the <a href="#">South African Consulate in Los Angeles</a> and the Consulate of their country of citizenship for questions about obtaining a passport and/or a visa for travel to South Africa.</i></p>	<p><b>Passport Application Location &amp; Hours:</b> Orange Post Office 1075 North Tustin St., Orange CA 92863</p> <p>Hours: Monday-Friday by appointment only. To find a complete list of passport application locations near you, <a href="#">Click here</a>.</p> <p><b>Passport Timing: Apply as soon as possible.</b> <u>Color passport copies must be turned in on April 2, 2019.</u> It takes four to six weeks to process a passport. Parental Consent Affidavit</b></p> <p><u>Both parents</u> are required to complete, and have notarized, three <a href="#">Affidavits of Consent for Children Traveling Abroad</a> – The affidavits should be filled out with information for 1 – the teacher accompanying the students, 2 – the second adult accompanying the students, and 3 – Mankwe Wildlife Reserve scientist or reserve manager.</p> <p>Students who plan to travel with an affidavit from only one parent must carry a legal document showing the single parent has sole legal and physical custody, or a legal document showing the second parent is deceased.</p> <p><b>B. Official Certified Copy of Unabridged Birth Certificate</b></p> <p>While traveling, students are required to carry an original or an "official certified copy" of an "unabridged birth certificate." An unabridged" birth certificate identifies the parents of the child on the birth certificate. A child born to a single mother, without a father identified on the birth certificate, is also considered an unabridged birth certificate.</p> <p><b>C. Color Copy of Each Parent's Identification</b></p> <p>Passports are preferred. Current driver's licenses are second choice documents.</p>
